



How Much Does Data Matter?

- Analytics will remain an increasing driver of decision-making
- Moving to risk is inevitable for most of your revenue
- Must understand your actuarial risk







- EHRs are harming care delivery
- Mental health burden of documentation according to a prescribed, inefficient electronic workflow
- Causing physicians to retire early, change careers, or just walk away
- Priorities are wrong







- EHRs are controlled by just a few companies: Allscripts, Cerner, Epic, NextGen
- Little progress has been made on interoperability
- Technology innovation is inhibited

The Cost of Care




- Healthcare costs on track for 6.5% - 8% increase this year
- Medicare and full-risk direct contracting: What happened?
- 46% of payer CFOs think risk payment is part of the future
- Price transparency is critical for a value-based delivery system
- \$40k hip vs. a \$100k hip shouldn't the public know?



What Does It All Mean?



- Rapid change is inevitable
- Planning: 18 mo 3 years
- Innovation must be monitored, execution managed, and options filtered as to what is effective
- Revenue increases by codes and procedures will only happen minimally
- Profitability will require doing business more efficiently
- If no change is put in place, look out for inflation
