Outcomes:


- Increase market share

January 1, 2016:

Novant Health + UVA Health create NH UVA Health System Joint Operating Company with 60/40 split ownership

January 21, 2021: UVA Health signed non-binding Letter of Intent

February 13. 2021: Due Diligence process officially kicked-off













2017 - 2020

Prince William Medical Center and Haymarket Medical Center operate on Novant Health corporate services; Culpeper Medical Center operates as stand-alone July 1, 2021: Transaction Closed; UVA obtains full ownership of UVA Community Healthwith Transition Service Agreement and SOWs to maintain seamless operations through June 30, 2023




