

2021 Enrollment by College or School






COVID-19 in Virginia


While VCU Health battled COVID, we also...

VCU's Economic Impact in Virginia

Within the **Richmond MSA**, **VCU-associated spending**** in FY20 generated:

- An annual economic impact of ~\$6.3 billion
- 44,000 jobs
- For every \$1.00 that VCU spends on operations, maintenance and labor, the Richmond MSA experiences an economic impact of \$2.78


Statewide, VCU-associated spending* in FY20 generated::

- An annual economic impact of ~\$9.5 billion
- 58,000 jobs
- For every \$1.00 VCU spends on operations, maintenance and labor, Virginia experiences an economic impact of \$2.47




Four Major Themes:




Life expectancy vs. health expenditure Our World in Data


Health Impact Pyramid






