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An HFMA Tennessee Chapter interview with West Tennessee Healthcare's Bart Teague.

We are entering into 2021: What have you found to be the biggest challenge this early into the year?

I would say dealing with competing priorities after the lull of the holidays. It seems activity was put on hold during the holiday season in some cases, and now it's time to hit the ground running with lots of high priorities. This is really nothing new for this time of year, but it presents challenges for prioritization and time management.

What do you predict may be the biggest opportunity in healthcare finance in 2021?

One of the biggest challenges is likely to be difficulty in planning, forecasting, and budgeting due to uncertainty about what the future holds, particularly relative to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our patient volumes ranged from very low to very high in 2020, making it difficult to predict going forward. I'm hopeful we will see some stabilizing over the next few months.

Are there strategies that you will have this year that vary significantly from 2020? Why or why not?

It depends on how you look at it, but I think our strategies will be somewhat different in 2021 compared to 2020. I hope, and expect, that less of our attention and resources will need to be directed toward the pandemic as the year moves along. In 2020, the pandemic and Public Health Emergency accelerated some of our initiatives, like telemedicine, working remotely, and remote patient monitoring; and it caused us to delay or slow down on some of our other initiatives. With a great deal of uncertainty still about what the future holds, we need to be nimble and able to adjust quickly. To help with that we've established a shorter term approach to budgeting and evaluating financial performance, to allow opportunity for quicker adjustments.

How important is it to network with other systems? What are the pros/cons of doing so?

I think it's vitally important, especially during these uncertain times. We can learn a great deal from each other. By sharing and communicating our successes and lessons learned we can all achieve more. In healthcare, and specifically revenue cycle, we encounter change continually – new services, technologies, laws and regulations, payer requirements. We can benefit greatly by exchanging ideas and information with our peers in other organizations on how we're responding to these changes.

WTH represents a large part of the care in your area. What do you see from your communities as their top needs from your system?

Access to high quality care, especially primary care, is vital to our rural communities. Chronic health conditions, such as hypertension and diabetes, and also behavioral health needs, are prevalent in these communities, so we are working to provide primary care and behavioral health services through alternative models, such as telehealth as quickly as possible. During 2020, with the introduction of COVID-19 into the community, the system accelerated implementation of telehealth services and remote patient monitoring at home to enhance services where access to care was limited.

What are the top 3-5 goals for 2021 both personally and for your system?

One of our top goals is to improve the patient experience, including the way we engage and interact with patients from a billing and revenue cycle perspective. Another is to continue to optimize and refine systems and processes, particularly related to new technologies we've recently implemented. Also, for Revenue Cycle, we will focus on maintaining and improving revenue cycle key performance indicators, especially indicators of revenue leakage. Also, we have a major system implementation planned for this year. It's certainly an important goal to have a successful implementation and a smooth transition overall.

Is there anything else you would like our audience to know?

We remain focused on our mission - To improve the health and well-being of the communities we serve while providing exceptional and compassionate care. We're here to serve our patients and communities and we strive every day to do that in the best way possible.
