

## PROVIDER SPOTLIGHT

An HFMA TN
Chapter interview
with Erlanger
Health System's
Senior Director of
Revenue Cycle, Misty
Brackett.

## How did you become such an active member in the HFMA TN Chapter?

I love being involved in organizations and making a difference where I can. I was not as active a few years ago until I met Buffy Loveday. She welcomed me in and got me plugged in, which has been very beneficial to me both personally and professionally.

## What are some of the benefits you receive from HFMA specific to the Tennessee Chapter?

First and foremost, I have a wide network of people I can reach out to with questions across the state. Since we are all in the same state, we all experience the same issues. Having relationships with other Tennessee providers helps to not recreate the wheel. We can bounce ideas off each other and come to quicker resolutions. I have also met people that I feel will be lifelong friends!

## As Senior Director of Revenue Cycle at Erlanger, what is something about your job that people might be surprised to hear?

My responsibilities that differ from what people might expect of a Senior Director of Revenue Cycle include PCI Compliance and overseeing merchant processors.

## What do you see as the immediate needs for Erlanger within Revenue Cycle between now and the end of the year?

We are in the same boat as everyone else, staffing is hard to find. We are running short in all our areas; our most desperate need right now is in registration. Every shift, we run between 1 to 2 full time employees short.

## With 2022 right around the corner, what are some goals that Erlanger has in mind for the new year?

Our goals mirror everyone else's in the Tennessee market: reduce denials and AR days, increase POS collections, and increase cash coming in from our payers. Erlanger has a goal to be in the top 10% when looking at Epic's pulse report.

## Are there any unique initiatives that you've been involved with at Erlanger (in the past or upcoming) that you want to brag about?

Yes, in our denial reduction initiative we found a lot of claims being denied for no precert on our surgeries even though a pre-cert was obtained on what was scheduled. As we dug into the issue, we found that we had an issue with doctors scheduling one thing and then when their documentation was coded it was not exactly what was scheduled. To remedy this, I worked with Epic to build a queue that captured any code that was different than what was scheduled or if the provider knew the procedure changed, they update their logs allowing the case to fall into the same queue. To make this successful we have our HIM department coding same day or the next, this allows our pre-cert team to update the pre-cert based on the payers guidelines.

## Has Erlanger ever partnered with any charitable organizations in Chattanooga or elsewhere?

We do partner with the United Way; however, we are all very focused on building up our Children's Hospital and practices through the Believe program.


